Prohibition was instituted with the ratification of the 18<sup>th</sup> Amendment on January 16<sup>th</sup>, 1919, and then repealed with the 21<sup>st</sup> Amendment on December 5<sup>th</sup>, 1933 – but this didn't mean all U.S. Cities were free to booze it up. Right here in Bentonville, we remained a dry county until November 6<sup>th</sup>, 2012. In honor of our release from Prohibition, please join us as we celebrate National Repeal Day. Today is a reminder of the rich traditions of craft fermentation and distillation, the legitimacy of the American bartender as a contributor to the culinary arts, and the responsible enjoyment of alcohol as a sacred social custom.
