Prohibition was instituted with the ratification of the 18th Amendment on January 16th, 1919, and then repealed with the 21st Amendment on December 5th, 1933 – but this didn't mean all U.S. cities were free to booze it up. Right here in Bentonville we remained a dry county until November 6th, 2012. In honor of our release from Prohibition, please join us as we celebrate National Repeal Day. Today is a reminder of the rich traditions of craft fermentation and distillation, the legitimacy of the American bartender as a contributor to the culinary arts, and the responsible enjoyment of alcohol as a sacred social custom.
